



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Arkansas Children's Week April 6-12, 2024

Theme: Sharing Key Experiences

Arkansas Children's Week (ACW) has been a statewide tradition for more than 30 years! ACW celebrates children of all ages and their educators and families. Through ACW, early educators and youth development professionals highlight the needs of children and families and the accomplishments of the adults who work with them.

We consider ways to support learning and development through 5 key experiences.

- Constructive Experiences, when children design and build.
- Imaginative Play, when children pretend.
- Creative Expression, when children communicate through art, music, and more.
- Exploratory and Investigative Experiences, when children discover the world around them.
- Active, Physical Play, when children experience movement and motion through vigorous play.

Communities and individual programs celebrate Arkansas Children's Week in many different ways. Events in recent years have included open house events, children's concerts, fun fairs, story walks, and more.
